Abstract

Multicriteria decision aid (MCDA) methods are used to support decision making in case of problems where conflicting economic, environmental, societal, technical, and aesthetic objectives are involved. This is why MCDA is increasingly applied for questions concerning sustainable development.

MCDA methods differ in the way the idea of multiple criteria is operationalised. In particular each method shows its own properties with respect to the way of assessing criteria, the application and computation of weights, the mathematical algorithm utilised, the model to describe the system of preferences of the individual
